Hosted by WLI, the Montana Lakes Conference will gather diverse resource professionals to exchange information, scientific advancements, and management strategies that promote clean and healthy lake and reservoir ecosystems. Participants from academic, nonprofit, government, business organizations, and the public will gather to learn about improving the health of Montana’s lakes through science and monitoring advances, watershed restoration practices, policy innovation, and collaborative stakeholder involvement.

Shawn Devlin Joins WLI Staff

Shawn Devlin, an Assistant Research Professor for Aquatic Ecology at the University of Montana Flathead Lake Biological Station (FLBS), has joined the WLI on a part time basis as an Aquatic Ecologist to conduct research on current projects with WLI staff.

“This is an excellent opportunity for WLI to expand its scientific research capacity and for our two organizations to increase our collaborative partnership to further watershed science,” commented Mike Koopal, WLI’s Founder and Executive Director. “I expect Shawn to expand our integrated knowledge of Whitefish Lake and answer some lingering questions about lake dynamics so that our community can better manage this headwaters lake.” Devlin and Koopal are also partnering on a research paper to describe the unique and complex dynamics of Tally Lake. (Devlin con't from Page 1)... lead author on "Spatial and Temporal Dynamics of Invasive Freshwater Shrimp (*Mysis Diluviana*): Long-Term Effects on Ecosystem Properties in a Large Oligotrophic Lake" published in the journal *Ecosystems*.

Devlin's efforts at the FLBS encompass work with a sophisticated computer model and the extensive dataset collected on Flathead Lake by FLBS researchers over the past 35 years. Devlin earned his Ph.D. from Wright State University in Dayton, Ohio and a B.Sc. in Environmental Biology from Unity College in Unity Maine. He conducted postdoctoral research at the University of Jyväskylä, Finland prior

to coming to work at the FLBS. Shawn received the 2017 Raymond B. Lindeman Award from the Association for the Sciences of Limnology and Oceanography (ASLO), one of the world's largest and most prestigious international societies for water scientists. The Lindeman Award recognizes an outstanding paper written by a young aquatic scientist. His paper, "Top Consumer Abundance Influences Lake Methane Efflux" published in the journal *Nature Communications*, showed that methane released from a lake was greatly influenced by the presence or absence of fish.

Ripple Effect Scholarship Awarded

We are pleased to announce the recipient of the 2018 Ripple Effect Scholarship. Chloe (Pixie) Moore will use the \$500 scholarship to study marine biology at the University of Hawai'i at Manoa in Honolulu. Pixie will graduate from Whitefish High School this spring and has grown up on the shores of Whitefish Lake. She hopes to "gain an education about water ecosystems that equips [her] for handling the ever rapid changes in the natural environment." Pixie fostered her interest in marine biology through her time spent on the beaches of Playa Grande in Costa Rica. Specifically, she's interested in studying water ecosystems and how they will handle the effects of climate change. We wish Pixie the best of luck with her pursuits!

The Prevention & Decontamination Station has moved to the west side of Hwy 93, across from Don "K" Chevrolet just north of JP Road.

Please join us in protecting Whitefish Lake and its surrounding waterbodies from aquatic invasive species (AIS) by understanding the risk of AIS, following *Clean.Drain.Dry* protocols, and participating in the On-line Self-Certification program for Non-Motorized, Hand-Launched watercraft.
