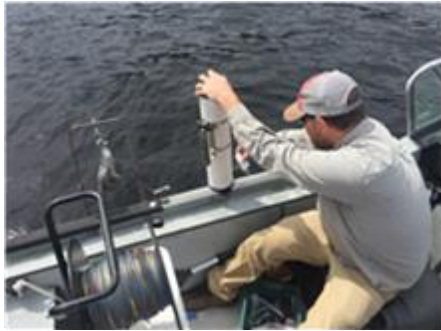

Dr. Shawn Devlin is an Assistant Research Professor at the University of Montana's Flathead Lake Biological Station and is Whitefish Lake Institute's part-time Aquatic Ecologist. His research has focused on trophic interactions, long term data, littoral zone dynamics, ecosystem modeling, and benthic microbial function.

Shawn is a recipient of the *Raymond L. Lindeman Award* by the Association for the Sciences of Limnology and Oceanography (ASLO) honoring a young author for an outstanding peer-reviewed, English-language paper in the aquatic sciences. Devlin and colleagues' Nature Communications paper entitled, "Top consumer abundance influences lake methane efflux" documents a novel whole-ecosystem experiment showing that food web structure can control methane efflux from lakes.
