The Montana Lakes Conference is an important platform for generating solutions to water quality challenges faced by Whitefish Lake and other lakes in Montana. The conference, taking place October 18 – 20, 2023 at The Lodge at Whitefish Lake, will bring together scientists, managers, policy makers, and citizens for 2.5 days. Presentations given by experts in the fields of lake and reservoir science, aquatic invasive species, water pollutants, recreational impacts, development impacts, climate change, and water supply. WLI anticipates 200 attendees, 40 speakers, a robust poster session, and keynote and plenary sessions. The conference will celebrate Montana's lakes and the people who work to understand and protect them.

Andrew Sansom Ph.D., will deliver the conference keynote address. He is the Founder & Professor of Practice at The Meadows Center for Water and the Environment in Texas. Dr. Sansom is a leading conservationist in the management and protection of natural resources and is a recipient of conservation awards from the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation, the National Park Foundation, the International Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies and the Nature Conservancy.

Jim Elser Ph.D., Director of the Flathead Lake Biological Station, will present a plenary. (continued on Page 2...)

A preconference workshop will be offered on Wednesday, October 18<sup>th</sup> titled: "Water Conflict Management & Transformation" lead by Aaron Wolf, Ph.D. and Todd Voteller, Ph.D. from fourworlds.org. Four Worlds is dedicated to the positive transformation of our relationship to the world's water and works to build healthy relationships and outcomes through scientific mediation, capacity building, and technical assessment. Water professionals and the public are encouraged to register for this meaningful training workshop. The four-hour workshop will provide continuing education credits for professionals.

The conference will officially open with a Community Night and Conference Welcome Reception Wednesday evening. The evening will include a Youth Poster Session with presenters from local middle and high schools, and the popular WLI Science Quencher featuring lightning round talks from experts that will be presenting at the conference. The Youth Poster Session and the Science Quencher are free and open to the public.
